California

- **California AI Transparency Act** (AB 2013, SB 942) targeting automated decision-making and requiring training-data disclosures, set to take effect in 2026 [reuters.com+15iapp.org+15thebeckagefirm.com+15taftlaw.com](https://www.reuters.com/technology/ai-transparency-act-california-2023-07-07/).

Other State Actions & Guidance

- **Massachusetts, Oregon, New Jersey, and Texas AG** offices have issued enforcement actions or guidance under consumer-protection, privacy, and anti-discrimination statutes—though without standalone AI laws [reuters.com](https://www.reuters.com/legal/privacy/2023/07/07/ai-law-enforcement-actions/).

- By June 2025, **48 states plus Puerto Rico** have introduced AI-related bills; **26 states** enacted at least one measure [thebeckagefirm.com+1ncsl.org+1](#).
- **Maryland** and **Illinois** have enacted broader AI-related laws (e.g., Illinois Supreme Court AI policy effective January 1, 2025) .

- **Private sector regulation:** CA, CO, UT, TX, TN, NY, MT laws.
- **Government-use restrictions:** Montana’s state/local limits.
- **Enforcement via AGs/regulators:** Broad actions in MA, OR, NJ, TX AG.

⚙️ What’s Next?

- Many state laws take effect in late 2025 or early 2026—so compliance deadlines are coming soon.
- Federal action is still uncertain, but with the moratorium struck from the “Big Beautiful Bill,” states retain authority
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- State-level regulators (AGs) are watching enforcement cases (e.g., deepfakes, discrimination).
