#### Other State Actions & Guidance

 Massachusetts, Oregon, New Jersey, and Texas AG offices have issued enforcement actions or guidance under consumer-protection, privacy, and anti-discrimination statutes—though without standalone AI laws <u>reuters.com</u>.

- By June 2025, **48 states plus Puerto Rico** have introduced AI-related bills; **26 states** enacted at least one measure thebeckagefirm.com+1ncsl.org+1.
- Maryland and Illinois have enacted broader Al-related laws (e.g., Illinois Supreme Court Al policy effective January 1, 2025).

## **⊗** What's Next?

- Many state laws take effect in late 2025 or early 2026—so compliance deadlines are coming soon.
- Federal action is still uncertain, but with the moratorium struck from the "Big Beautiful Bill," states retain authority
